Government College, Sanawal is affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru University, Sarguja, Ambikapur. It follows rules and regulations of Department of Higher education, Chhattisgad and its affiliated university. It offers higher education programs B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc, with three courses in each program. The college is committed for all round development of the students; girls and boys by well planned teaching -learning and evaluation, sports, NSS and extension activities. Well planned internal evaluation activities are conducted as per schedule. Performance in the internal evaluation is discussed with students and necessary suggestions are given. To maintain transparency, assessed answer sheets are also shown to the students. Expert lectures and study tours have been organized to enrich the curricula. The informal feedbacks from students and other stakeholders on teaching learning and curricula are taken by the college. The college has its own institutional calendar prepared with the inputs from Department of Higher education of the state. Academic Calendar needs to be prepared as per UGC guidelines.

Number of students admitted to the sanctioned strength should be improved. Teacher students' ratio should be maintained as per UGC guidelines. Efforts should be made to fill up sanctioned position of teaching staff, non-teaching staff and technical staff. Certificate, add on courses be introduced. The feedbacks taken should be analysed and action should betaken accordingly.

This institute is the only college situated in the rural and tribal area of Balrampur district providing higher education in three streams; Arts, commerce and Science. The majority of the students belong to Tribal, rural and economically backwards classes. The maximum of seats are filled by ST/SC/OBC candidates. The institute appoints quest lecturers for the vacant posts. The teachers engage students with advanced teaching-learning methods involving group discussion, seminars, quiz competition, ICT, and motivate them to participate in extracurricular activities like debate, slogan writing, poster & sports events. They are also encouraged to participate in extension activities through NSS/YRC. Attendance of the students in classes is monitored. On the basis of performance in the university examinations, the students are identified as slow and advanced learners for whom different activities are conducted. The faculty monitors the performance of each and every student and provides academic guidance and psychological counseling. "Pranayam and Meditation" session is organized from time to time for mental peace and increase the concentration toward studies. A good academic environment is maintained. Dress code is available, gathering for prayer is compulsory, 75% attendance is compulsory. Student Enrolment percentage is less. Online teaching-learning needs is going on path of improvement.. Teachers' quality and communication skills be enriched with participation in orientation programs. The College needs to motivate teachers and students to conduct and attend courses on SWAYAM, ARPIT, NPTEL etc.

The college at present does not have a research facility due to a lack of postgraduate classes and fully furnished laboratories. However some faculty members have publications in refereed journals and books. Students are encouraged to take small research projects and surveys. Students are motivated to participate in social activities by organizing awareness rallies, health checkup camps, Swach Bharat abhiyan Internship, Digital transactions, plantation, through social Awareness camps in nearby localities NSS Unit is dynamic and active.. Efforts should be made to receive grants from government and non-government agencies for research projects. The college has MoUs but not activated.

The college is located on its own 12 acres of land. The college has had its own two storied building since 2016. The total built area of approx. is 54602 sq.ft, included two storied college building, girls hostel, staf quarter and stage for functions. The building is with 10 Classrooms (Seating Capacity of minimum 60 each), 4 laboratories, library, Sports and gymnasium hall, Girls common Room, NCC/YRC, staff room, principal cabin and canteen with adequate toilet facilities for men and women.. The college has one central library with approx 9558 books along with a reading room facility. There is a smart classroom with a smart projector and wifi facility. 4 classrooms have LCD projectors. Good and well maintained furniture as per the requirement is available. Laboratories are with required instruments and lab materials. The institution provides sport coaching facilities with assistance of other govt. Institutions.. There are well-furnished classrooms with whiteboards. e-resources and common computer lab are also available. Research journals, magazines, and competitive exam books are available.. Teachers are providing their own money to students for preparing competative exams. A bio-diversity lab is also developed.... Student-Computer ratio should be improved. Fund should be allotted for maintenance of infrastructure. The library and sport facilities are being used properly. Sanitary vending machine is placed in the women's common room. Parking area is seperately developed.

The institute publishes prospectus and makes it available to all students at the time of admission. Admission rules, regulations and procedures are also placed college on website.. The information about, admissions, fees, scholarships, code of conduct, feedback formats are informed well in advance and can be accessed by the students easily. The admission process is online conducted by the university. The reservation policy of the state government is well observed for the admissions. The care of differently ablled students is taken properly. Vigilannce is done by discipline committee to avoid any kind of nuisance /ragging activities in college. Various motivational & skill development programs like Computer Training, self-defense and health care - yoga camp and Motivational speeches are organised. College faculty provides free Coaching for Competitive Exams and Spoken English. Coaching campsare organised for students participating in sports. Students progression towards Post graduate Education (M.A./M.sc./M.Com.) as well as in B.Ed./D.Ed./PGDCA is seen. The students are placed on various jobs and many students are selfemployed doing some small bussiness. State government scholarships are availed to the students. Meritorious students should be provided scholarship. Coaching facilities should be strengthened for competitive exams. Placement cell is required in the institution. Students should be encouraged to participate in sports activity at different levels. College do not have equal opportunity office (EOO), no separate room for Internal Complaints Committee and women empowerment cell, language lab is there but it should be actively available to the students. Personal counselling is there but no counseling centre. The college magazine "Hum Hoge kamyab is published annually."

There is proper waste water management system. All the students are encouraged not to waste water & electricity. The institution gives importance to the safety of the students. No outsiders are allowed inside the premises without prior permission from the principal. It is mandatory to all visitors to report in visitors' registers. More CCTV cameras should be placed in the campus on top priority for the coming session. A rainwater harvesting system is installed on campus for recharging the ground water level.. The fire extinguisher is also available. Some of the best practices done by the institute are Regular prayer, Yoga & Meditation Practice. There is efficient use of social media for library services and social values. Need based technical services are taken from local people for repairing, painting, gardening etc. Offering a sapling in a place of floral bouquet for guests is eco friendly and economical practice.. Donating books of competitive exam by stakeholders is good practice.. NSS Unit is working with the local community as per their national, local and social needs. Our best practices are-plastic-free green campus and NSS. Alternate source of energy and energy conservation measures should be installed. Institute is aware about environment so it has maintained plastic free green campus Institute is aware about socialwelfare and working for the local community and society. The programs - Gender equality, Solid waste managementRainwater harvesting are the best practices.
